Geography Bee Finalist

MHMS seventh grader Alex Copley finished fourth in the state at the National Geographic Bee last week! One hundred semi-finalists, who themselves were all school champions and top scorers on a written geography test, competed at Nashville's Fisk University on March 30. Alex had a perfect score in Friday's preliminary rounds, automatically making him one of the top ten finalists. To finish in fourth place, he then beat out several more experienced competitors, despite this having only been Alex's first time participating in the Bee! We are incredibly proud of his accomplishment. For others who are interested, the National Geographic Bee is open to all students in grades 4-8, and tests students' general knowledge of geography. School-level competitions for next year will begin in November.

Speech and Drama

The Merrol Hyde Magnet School speech team took home top awards at the Tennessee High School Speech and Drama League District Two Tournament March 24th.

Four MHMS students claimed first place trophies -- the most of any school in the district. 19 MHMS students were finalists -- a new school record. Of the 19 finalists, 11 have qualified for the state competition - another MHMS record.

District Champions were: Mary Welch, Original Oratory; Tanner Cole, After Dinner Speaking; Tori Thiessen, Prose; and Regan Manayan, Extemporaneous Speaking.

15 other MHMS students claimed awards including: Denise Buliga, 2nd place, Original Oratory; Josh Lassiter, 2nd place, Pantomime; Kaitlin Carter, 2nd place, Storytelling; Holland Curtis, 3rd place, Solo Acting; Shelbi Bertsch/Kyra Manayan, 3rd place, Duo Acting; Alex Brewer, 3rd place, Impromptu Speaking; Rose Daugherty, 4th place, Solo Acting; Siddhant Thukral, 4th place Impromptu Speaking; Connor Cutright, 5th place, After Dinner Speaking; Toni Hamilton, 5th place, Storytelling; Kathleen Marsh/Emma Piliponis, 5th place, Duo Acting; Tucker Cowden, 6th place, Original Oratory; Savannah Hall, 6th place, Poetry; Tanner Marion, 6th place, Pantomime; Matt Riddle, 6th place, TV Broadcasting.

The team earned an overall 2nd place finish.
