Absence Rules

Absences require a written note from the parent or more formal documentation in order to be excused. A parent note or physician's excuse note must be turned in to the classroom teacher (for elementary students) and to the office (for middle and high school students) when the student returns to school.

- A student is allowed five (5) days of parent notes per
- semester. All other absences require formal docu-
- mentation to consider the student's absence excused.
- All vacations/trips must have prior approval from the principal.

High School Students:

TCA 49-6-3017(f) Any student under 18 years of age...who has more than 10 consecutive or 15 total days unexcused in a semester shall not be considered as making satisfactory academic progress and the student's motor vehicle driver license shall be suspended; or if the student does not have a motor vehicle driver license, the student shall be ineligible to obtain a motor vehicle driver license until the student reaches 18 years of age.

3rd Grade Guest Speaker

Third grade began their unit of study on Communities by welcoming Brenda Payne, President and CEO of Hendersonville Chamber of Commerce, as their guest speaker. Mrs. Payne was enthusiastic about sharing her wealth of knowledge about the area she loves, Hendersonville, TN.

• Mrs. Payne began with the history of the area by going

- back 225 years ago when long hunters first discovered
- the area as an excellent area to hunt. Rock Castle was
- the first home of the Daniel Smith family, and Hender-
- sonville remained a rural community until the Corp
- decided to build Old Hickory dam for flood controlcreating Old Hickory Lake. This caught the attention of
- musicians and entertainers from Nashville who loved
- the privacy, lake area, and convenience to Nashville and
- began to move into the area. Hendersonville was chartered in 1969.
- Mrs. Payne told students about current planning for our
- area, as well as former and existing government officials.
- She also explained how city officials help keep Hender-
- sonville clean, safe, and beautiful.
- When asked about some of the most important events
- to ever happen in Hendersonville, she responded that
- the creation of Merrol Hyde Magnet School was a proud
- achievement for the city. The hospital being built here in
- 1971, and the development of the Indian Lake area also
- earned honorable mentions.



The Portrait of Hendersonville, a magazine published by the chamber, was given to all the third graders. On the front cover was former Hendersonville resident Taylor Swift, and on p. 20 were familiar faces to MHMS, Mrs. Schreiner and Mrs. Hunter, accepting the Blue Ribbon School award from Dr. Phillips.
